FMPSD Presentation:

- The district wanted to come to all the schools in the district to give a presentation about feeling safe and belonging at FMPSD.
 - We (the district) follow ATA, Legislation and Education Act (35.1/16.1(6)) and use this to make decisions.
 - If students want to start a GSA group then they have to be allowed to do this. This group is just meant to be a get together for the students. A teacher must facilitate this and help them set up this group. This group is not meant to sit around and talk about SOGI things, it is just there to provide a safe space for students. Statistics show that when kids do not feel like they belong then they are more likely to have mental health concerns. The point of the groups is to help kids feel like they belong.
 - The resources on SOGI are for educators to use to help them when kids come to them with questions. It helps them find age appropriate books to use when a kid comes to them for help.
 - The curriculum does not contain SOGI topics.
 - PRISM book is used and can be found online. It is professional learning for staff, not lesson plans.
 - When the counselors in schools hear information from students about their thoughts, they are encouraged to talk to Mom and Dad or a safe person at home.
 - All books that are approved by the ATA that talk about these topics are in a list and are age appropriate. The librarians are currently going through all books in their libraries to vet all the books and make sure the principal knows what is in the library. Then they go to appropriate places in the library.

Summary: The tools that we have are meant for teacher learnings so that they can deal with questions and issues that come up in the classroom and can be then addressed on a case by case basis (not to the whole class). If parents have issues with books in the school, they can talk to the principal about them as the principal will have vetted all the books. Current focus is to highlight ways people are all the same rather than how we are different.

- We were at 234 in June, currently at 283/285. Lots to Div 1, now two kindergartens and a Grade 1/2 blended. Hired alumni from the school for this role.
- Terry Fox today. Hoping to raise \$2500, now at \$955.
- Parents can come Monday morning for Creation Ministries International at 8:30am 9:30am. This presentation is geared towards kids. At 10am there will be a Junior high presentation.
- Friday is Picture Day.
 - A Parent brought up a concern about kids loosing Gym time when pictures are booked on a Mon/Wed/Friday. We will try and request a different day, other than our Gym day for retakes day and spring photo day.
- We are running into difficulties scheduling Gym with the growth of the school. Hard to get all classes their time slots when we only have the gym 3 days a week.
- The Junior Highs are going to Maqua lake on Thursday. Invitation for parents to join Geoff if they would like.
- The Christian Education Evening is Oct 4th. PCCE will hopefully be joining online and 3 teachers will present their goals for the classes for this year.
- Book Fair is Oct 4th and 5th
- Missions Trip planning meeting tomorrow night for Grade 8 and 9. Roughly \$2500 per student, planning to do a lot of fundraising, to get that down to \$100-200 per student out of pocket. Society also has a line item for this to help make sure that all kids take part and money is not an issue.
- Hoping to take Gr 6 and 7 to go to Edmonton for the soup kitchen.
- Plan as a school to continue to build community and relationships with Churches this year.
