What is a Storyline?

A Storyline is a thematic way for teachers and students to learn together, and deepen their own personal relationships with The Almighty. Storylines help create "a powerful and compelling vision of the Kingdom that creates a longing and a desire within every student to play their part in God's unfolding Story of Redemption." This overarching focus helps forge many more connections between what students are doing at school and their lives at home.

What is a Deep Hope?

A Deep Hope is what we as teachers passionately hope your children learn while being a part of our school community. When they leave our classes, these are the lessons we hope they have stored away in their hearts and minds.

What is FLEx?

Formational Learning Experiences are opportunities for students to apply what they have learned in their classes. FLEx activities are real activities that solve real-world problems, thereby enhancing our communities

Deep Hope

We live in a world of immense *brokenness*, and our young people are exposed to this more than ever. It is my deep hope that the young people I interact with will become believers who know, believe and demonstrate that all people's lives matter. Regardless of the differences we have in our community, we all matter to God.

Koinonia is a transliterated form of the Greek word κοινωνία, which refers to concepts such as: communion or fellowship, joint participation, the share which one has in anything, a gift jointly contributed, a collection, a contribution (Wikipedia). The essential element of *koinonia* is participation—Christ is what connects us (Biblestudytools.com). How can we show the world God's love if we are not in connection and relationship with the *broken*, the hurting, and the healed?

FLEx - Real work with Real people, with Real problems

In discovering where and what brokenness looks like in our world, we are naturally wired to step in and help. In Ephesians 2:10 we are called to be the hands and feet of God, to do the work of God here and now. Students in junior high will become active participants in creating Shalom and community in:

- offering leadership in our school
- participating in The Edmonton Mustard Seed Demo Crew
- offering their time to social profit organizations in Fort McMurray like A Safe Haven For Adolescent Mothers (ASHFAM), the Soup Kitchen, and the Salvation Army

What do Storylines, Deep Hope, and FLEx activities look like in our school?

FLEx

This year students have assumed the role of class leaders during Indoor Recesses, designing their own activities for classes in either Division 1 (Grades 1-3) or Division 2 (Grades 4, 5).

They are also participating in various charitable events concerning the larger community. One example of this is the Mustard Seed organization's youth outreach program in Edmonton.

What do Storylines, Deep Hope, and FLEx activities look like in our school?

Science/Math Storyline - "Wise and Ready"

Deep hope: Research shows that most people make a decision about their faith very early in life. Thus, our deep hope is that we will prepare young Christians for all aspects of life, most notably the importance of a well-reasoned foundation for their faith. To achieve this, we address the doubts and concerns that students have about science and other current issues so they have the tools they need to navigate life beyond the middle school years energized by a strong faith, a living (deep) hope, and love in action.




Why Choose Fort McMurray Christian School?

Academics

Fort McMurray Christian School has an established history of strong academic achievement, with regard to the Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests. Over the past three years, the school has scored well above the provincial average in all subject areas tested, including Mathematics, Social, Science, and Language Arts. We also placed 76th out of 853 schools in the entire province on the 2019 Fraser report.





Worship Arts and Leadership

Fort McMurray Christian School has developed a unique course that builds capacity and understanding of worship for our junior high students. Worship Arts and Leadership began in the fall of 2019 after junior high students expressed an interest in playing a more active role in our school worship times.

Students who register in Worship Arts and Leadership can do so in one of three streams: music, technology and the arts. Each stream develops projects and contributions to worship that are a meaningful reflection of their understanding of the role that worship plays in our calling as Christians.

Safe and Caring Environment

Parents know that their children are safe and cared for at Fort McMurray Christian School. We are consistently rated above provincial averages by parents, with regard to creating a safe and caring school environment. We strive to follow Jesus' command to love one another in all we do.

Matthew 22:36-40 - "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments."

Since we are also one of only two schools in Fort McMurray, that house both elementary and junior high grades, our students are able to grow and work together. Most importantly, our junior high students are able to work with younger kids and act as leaders in our school community.

Worship Assemblies

At Fort McMurray Christian School, our weekly Worship Assemblies have become an important part of our community. During this time, students are able to praise God together as a school and join together in prayer. These assemblies also host guest speakers from the city, including many pastors from local churches. Classes take turns hosting, which gives students an opportunity to help lead worship. Some of our junior high students even apply what they practice during our Worship Assemblies to help worship teams at their own churches!

ROAR Awards

Every week at our Worship Assemblies we award four ROAR (Representors Of the Amazing Redeemer) awards to students and teachers from various classes. These awards directly reflect the Throughlines we have been teaching students; we hope to encourage them to continue being image-reflectors at all times.



Although nominations often come from teachers, students are also quick to find and nominate their classmates as well. What a great way to share the love of Christ!

Athletics

Our students have many opportunities to participate in sports teams that compete with other schools across the district. Our school has an excellent athletic program and has been able to win at least one City Championship every year for the past five years. We currently have teams for archery, volleyball, basketball, badminton, and Track & Field for both boys and girls in Junior High.



PEAK Volleyball

PEAK is an acronym, which stands for Passion, Excellence, Attitude, and Knowledge.

This is a program that is run during the school day during optional courses for students. Our volleyball program focuses on training great volleyball players and supporting them in their efforts to realize the mission and vision of the school; using sports and reflective goal-setting as a means by which to achieve this. This program begins in grade 4 and extends up to grade 9, so our students can progress seamlessly from elementary to junior high.

Technology

Thanks to a strong and thriving School Council, we have received an abundance of educational technology for our students. Every junior high student at our school has access to a Chromebook and is able to use them throughout the day to help support their learning.





Extra-Curriculars

Aside from all the wonderful activities we engage in during the school day, we also offer many extra-curricular activities for students after classes end for the day. Our school regularly offers volleyball, basketball, badminton, track & field, archery, math club, robotics, ukulele lessons, band, and a Bible quizzing team.

Bible Quizzing

Bible Quizzing is a program run across the province in which students memorize portions of the Bible and compete in quiz style competitions. Last Christmas we were even able to host a students vs. adults game!

The following is a list of possible Options Courses that students may choose to participate in. Enrollment numbers will determine which of these are offered.

Worship Arts and Leadership

Students began the course with a seminar on Worship, where they worked to define worship in a post-modern world. Students were then divided into three areas of study based on their personal interests. These streams of study included *Behind the Scenes of Worship, the Instruments and Vocals of Worship,* and *Drama in Worship.* Each of these streams of study were designed to give students the skills and knowledge to plan, develop and work as a team to conduct a worship service.

Culinary Arts

In this Foods option, students will learn how to identify healthy foods and make healthy choices. Students will learn to chop, slice, and cook and bake using various recipes, always with hands-on experience. Students will learn why safety and cleanliness are so important in the kitchen. They will sample and share the food they make, thereby learning that much of the pleasure of food is sharing with others. Students will be encouraged to think of food as one of God's good gifts to us and so it is not to be wasted. Students will study kitchen safety, the names and use of kitchen tools, how to follow a recipe and lessons on a variety of food areas. Students can expect to take part in food labs and individual and group work assignments, gaining life skills that can be used to complete assignments where they will create dishes for a variety of audiences and situations.

Woodworking

In this option students will be introduced to the concepts and practice of Woodworking and be offered experiences in creating a wide variety of projects. A mandatory safety module is done in this course as well that ensures students are ready to work in the shop environment. Students will complete a variety of projects/activities to investigate the nature and applications of tools, equipment, materials, and safety when working with wood.


Outdoor Education

Students will learn about safety and survival skills and will engage in various projects and activities that give them experience with these skills. Specific topics will be determined by student interest and the teacher's abilities. The course may include activities such as snowboarding, building survival shelters, tying knots, navigation, camping, winter survival theory, and other outdoor enjoyment activities.

Computers and 3D Printing

In these options students will be challenged to complete a number of projects and assignments based on their prerequisite background in some of all of the following:

- Make a photo generator.
- Make a group YouTube channel.
- Edit pictures in Photography/video
- Learning how to use 3-D printers possibly including making a miniature 3-D representation of ourselves
- Coding JavaScript, Tynker, Python, code a game.
- School announcements to put on the YouTube channel.



Worship Arts and Leadership

The Worship Arts and Leadership course is divided into one of three areas of study: Behind the Scenes of Worship (Tech.), the Instruments and Vocals of Worship, and Drama in Worship. Each of these streams of study are designed to give students the skills and knowledge to plan, develop and work as a team to conduct a worship service.

Fabrics and Textiles

Students will learn how to use a sewing machine and basic tools to complete different assignments and projects; anyone who may have their own machine is encouraged to bring it to class, since equipment availability at school may limit enrollment numbers in this course. Students' focus will be determined based on experience, but instruction would usually begin with basic hand-sewing techniques such as threading a needle, tying a knot and sewing a button. As they develop, students' skills are then applied to various elective projects, where basic sewing pattern terms and pattern layouts are taught.

Second Languages (Possible Options: French, Spanish, Japanese, German, Filipino)

Learning a second language is an exciting and productive experience for students who wish to expand their horizons. The intent of international language courses is to promote a greater' familiarity with other cultures, by developing their proficiency in the languages associated with them. To that end, our instruction is largely focused on the five strands of language learning: reading, writing, listening, viewing and speaking.

Sports Performance

This option aims to provide students with opportunities to develop knowledge, skills, and attributes needed to understand the factors related to sports performance. This will be accomplished through a combination of theory and practical exposure to various areas of sport and training. Students will be expected to demonstrate outcomes related to sports injuries, sports studies, and personal development through active participation.

Photography

In this option, students will be encouraged to use technical expertise, creativity, and composition skills to produce and preserve images that visually tell a story or record an event. As a photographer, they will learn how to analyze and decide upon a subject and use various photographic techniques and equipment. School equipment of 35 mm digital Canon cameras will be provided for each student.

Cosmetology

In this option, students participate in intermediate studies in skincare, facial treatments, cosmetic makeup service, hair removal, manicures, pedicures, nail art, and gel nails.

Library Option

In this option, students will work with our school librarian to learn some of the basic skills of how a library operates. Students will learn how to categorize and check books. Students will become familiar with the Dewey Decimal system for organizing resources in a learning Commons setting. Given instruction on how books are to be organized within a library. Also will be given the opportunity to work with younger students when they visit the library.

School Yearbook

This option will be open to students in Grade 7- 9 and the focus will be complete to print our annual school yearbook for all of the FM Christian School community. Hard copies of past yearbooks are available for students to view. More information regarding this option will become available as we move into the calendar year.

Debate

In this option, students will learn effective use of language is essential for success in all curriculum areas. One useful way of integrating language learning is to focus on interdisciplinary processes. One such process which has been shown to be extremely successful is the use of speech and debate skills.

Other Information

LOCKERS

All junior high FMCS students are required to have a locker that is secured with a combination lock, provided by the school. There will be a \$5 fee charged to the student. This fee will be refunded at the end of the year, upon the return of the lock to the school. Students are required to use this lockl, and are not permitted to use one of their own. Students are encouraged to leave valuables at home. In accordance with our cell phone/personal electronics procedure, students who bring their devices to school are to leave them in the lockers for the duration of the instructional day.

Lockers need to be kept in a condition that is deemed satisfactory, by administration. Failure to do so may result in locker usage privileges being revoked; in addition, a fee of up to \$50.00 may be charged, in order to restore the locker to an acceptable condition.
