3. Networks Committee Meeting Info:

- School Council Networks 23/24 reports summary

- Mary attended the School Councils Network Committee meeting on April 8, the first of the year due to the CUPE strike.
- Key topics discussed:
 - Parent volunteers were needed across public schools, especially during the strike. FMCS was fortunate to have strong parent support—for example, with the hot lunch program.
 - Adjustments to class sizes.
 - Board member appreciation.
 - Lack of parent orientation resources.
 - Suggestions for how the board could better support school councils.
 - General concern over the board's perceived lack of support during the strike.

4. School Agendas - For the students/staff

- Melesa suggested introducing student planners as a standardized tool across all grades to help students take responsibility for homework and consistently share information with families.
- While teacher emails are appreciated, having something tangible in front of students—like a planner—encourages daily habit-building and accountability.

- **Student Demographic Confirmation:** Parents are encouraged to complete the form.
- Let's Grow Project: Successful first-year report.

- Education Plan: Approved by the Board of Trustees; presented by Geoff and Jonathan.
- **AEA Report:** Only 24 parents completed the survey.
- Staffing Update:
 - Additional elementary teacher needed (Grades 2–3, 4–5, and JH).
 FMCS has access to grads from King's that would be pursued if needed as they are Christian education trained. Christine to design a graphic ad.
 - Projected enrollment growth to 326 students.
 - Staff has grown by 7–8%.
- **Literacy Improvement:** There is general improvement across all grades. All but two classes are better than the FMPSD average.
- **TFT Report:** 56% of teachers have a high comfort level of implementing Christian Education/TfT in their classrooms.
- **Serve YMM:** 135 students took part, the sessions were impactful, and the event was highly successful.
